Megsie: A Pilgrim's Progress

What does Megsie's backpack represent? Why is it important that she lose her backpack when she reaches the Crossroads?

Folly and Chitchat are actually similar to Megsie- ordinary teenage girls living in the bizarre landscape of life. Compare and contrast Megsie and Folly and Chitchat.

Why is being permanently turned into an ornament similar to those who reject Christ and are sent to hell? Folly claims that *everyone* will get into the eternal city of Hometown (heaven), but she and Chitchat meet a ghastly demise instead. How does an "all roads lead to Rome" belief contrast to John 14:6?

How does Folly's "universal" approach to salvation contrast with Romans 10:9-13? Why is the reality that "everyone is *invited* but not everyone *accepts* the invitation" confusing to Folly?

What do you think Mr. Whirlywise and Rebel represent?

How are Leap, the Firefly, and Evangeline similar to the threesome found in 1 Corinthians 13:13?

Why do you think Megsie allows herself to be tempted into the digital valley of the shadow of death? Why is it sometimes easier to give in to evil temptation than it is to stay on the right course?

How do Megsie's weapons help her when she is bound in prison? If you are a believer in Christ, was are some of our "weapons of warfare" according to Scripture? How do these "weapons" free us from the bondage of sin or temptation?
